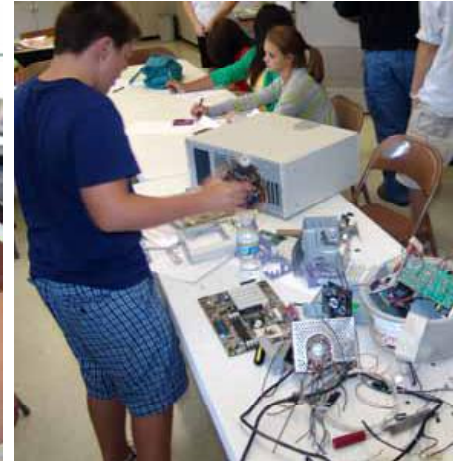

In the past five years our total sales have been as much as \$6,000 from the families, friends and relatives of our school.

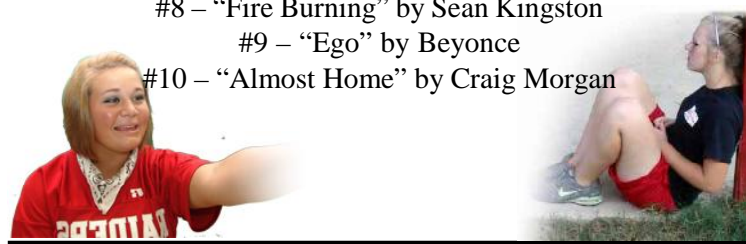
Each student is asked to sell at least three items. Students will be given information regarding prizes, etc. When your child brings home the packets, please take a few minutes to go through them.
