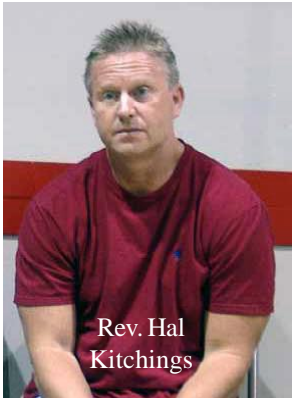

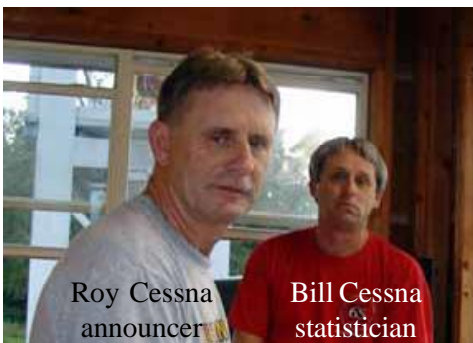


Rev. Hal Kitchings
